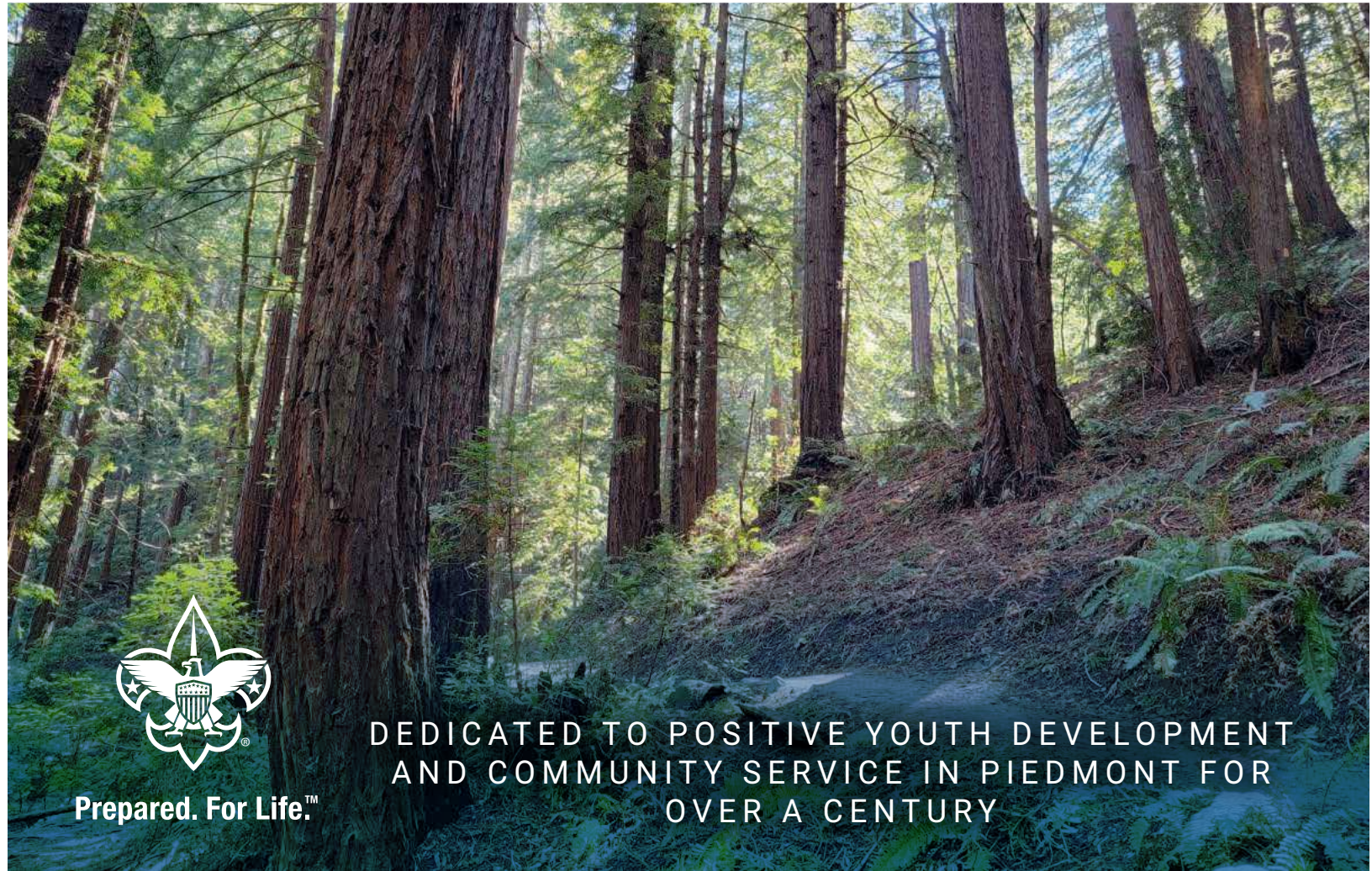

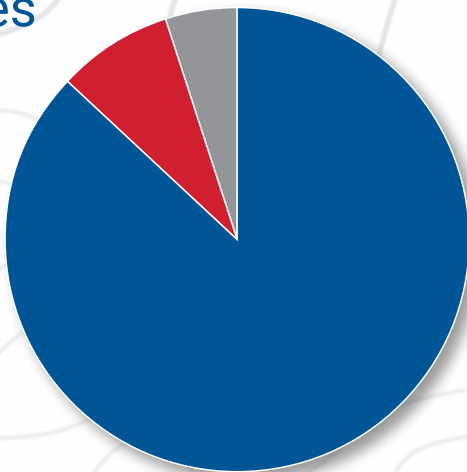

Expenses

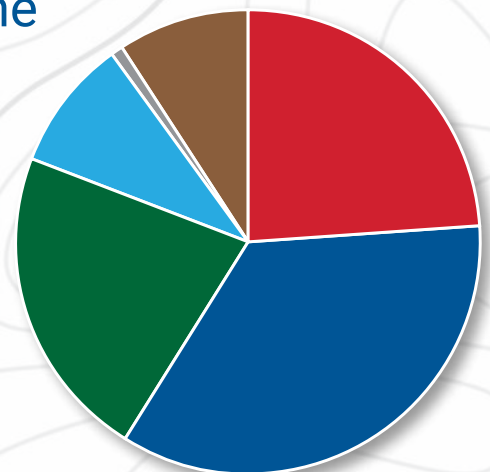
- Program (87%)
