# DESCRIPTION OF AWARDS

**SILVER BEAVER** – This award is presented to adult volunteers for exceptional service of an exceptional character to youth by registered Scouters, upon recommendation of the local council, and approval of the Executive Board of the National Council, Boy Scouts of America. In 1926, the first Silver Beaver was presented to Lord Baden Powell. Since that time the Piedmont Council has presented this honor to 106 people.

Each year the Piedmont Council is privileged to honor an individual with this coveted award. Because of the number of Scouters who are deserving of recognition, the selection of each year's recipient is a difficult task. We are appreciative of all our Scouters who make the Scouting programs possible for hundreds of Cub Scouts, Scouts, Venturers and Explorers.

**AWARD OF MERIT** – The Award of Merit is presented by Council to Scouters who render service of an outstanding nature at the district level. The nominee must be a registered Scouter and have rendered noteworthy service to youth in Scouting, outside of Scouting, or both.

**WILLIAM R. PETERSON AWARD FOR LEADERSHIP BY YOUTH** – This award was established in 1999 to honor William R. Peterson, a lifelong Scouter. This award is to recognize Piedmont Council youth, who through their leadership, demonstrate the benefits of being a youth run organization.

**SIDNEY C. SINGER SERVICE TO YOUTH AWARD** – This award was established in 1986 in honor of longtime Scouter, Sidney C. Singer, Jr. The award goes to a citizen of Piedmont who has performed outstanding service to youth in the community, either in or outside of the Scouting program.

**NESA OUTSTANDING EAGLE SCOUT - (NOESA)** was established during the BSA's 100th Anniversary in 2010 with the first recipient to receive the award a year later. The award was created to recognize notable Eagle Scouts who had either performed distinguished service at the local, state, or regional level or who were known nationally, but had not yet met the 25-year tenure as an Eagle for the Distinguished Eagle Scout Award.

**DISTINGUISHED SCOUTER** – This award was established in 1985 by the Piedmont Council. The award is presented to a person within a Cub, Scout, Venture, Explorer or Learning for Life unit that has given outstanding service to their unit within the past year. Selection is made by the unit committee or committee chair.

## Seth Hilton

Hilton was chosen for his calm and steady leadership as council president through uniquely challenging times. As he settled into the second year of his tenure, he helped the council navigate COVID, social distancing impacts on program, challenges faced by the National council, and the selection of a new executive director/Scout Executive.

In his professional life, he is a partner with Stoel Rives LLP. His practice includes advising independent energy producers, including renewable energy developers, and publicly-owned

and investor-owned utilities on energy and greenhouse gas regulation in California.

“One of the things that motivated me and helped me through the challenges were the other volunteers I was working with, and how dedicated they were,” said Hilton. “Also, having experienced the program as a youth, and having seen my son go through it, I knew firsthand how valuable the program is. The only path forward is through, and it was important to make sure our council made it through those challenges in the best shape possible.”
